GUIDELINES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

The Northern Mariner/Le marin du nord, is a fully refereed, quarterly journal published by the Canadian Nautical Research Society. It is distributed both to CNRS members, and to members of the North American Society of Oceanic History. The journal is also posted electronically. It is devoted to the study of maritime affairs and the inland waterways of the nations that touch the seas of the northern hemisphere. While the emphasis is on historical essays, the journal welcomes submissions which reflect other approaches or are interdisciplinary. Topics of interest include - but are not limited to - ships, shipbuilding, ship owning, technology, merchant shipping, trade, labour, maritime communities, ports, naval history, fishing, whaling, sealing, underwater archaeology, and maritime biography.

Articles should normally not exceed fourteen pages, (about 9,000 words), inclusive of footnotes. To stay within the page count, the word length must be reduced for maps, figures, and all other illustrative materials. Submissions for consideration in *The Northern Mariner/Le marin du nord* may be written in either English or French. Shorter research notes, of not more than 5,000 words, on a more narrow topic may also be considered. Contributions may be sent by e-mail to williamglover@mymts.net.

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
